



No other city is as closely tied to the rise of National Socialism as Munich. The Nazi Party was founded here in 1920 and quickly gained widespread popularity. At the same time, a few brave individuals recognized the dangers of the National Socialist Party and began to fight against it.

A highlight of the trip is the National Socialism and Resistance Walking Tour, which will teach your students all about the rise of the National Socialists, the resistance movements and how the city deals with its Nazi past.

Combine your history school trip to Munich with an excursion to Nuremburg and your students will stand on the ground where Hitler's 1923 party rally occurred, as well as the trials of prominent Nazis after the end of the Second World War.

Retrace the route of the 1923 Beer Hall Putsch; visit the former Concentration Camp of Dachau; explore the extraordinary party rally grounds in Nuremberg and examine how the Nazi party harnessed propaganda to achieve mass popularity.
