- **The passport of the student used to travel must be linked to the Settled Status number, which is the permanent residency grant in the UK.**

Are the EU students required to complete an ETA (Electronic Travel Authorisation) to enter the UK, from the EU?

No, as if they are residents in the UK, and studying in the UK, they should have been granted a Settlement Status, and therefore are not required to complete an ETA to enter the UK from the EU.

ETAs to enter the UK are only required for visitors to the UK, who are not resident in the UK.

- The party leader must carry a letter from the School confirming the enrolment of the student at the School and that you are travelling on a school trip. This letter must be on headed paper from School, dated and signed by Senior Management of the School.
- The party leader must carry the consent letter from parents, giving permission for the student to attend the trip. This letter must be signed and dated by one of the parents/guardians.
- **Some countries such as Italy, Spain, and Portugal have strict regulations regarding minors traveling without their legal guardians/parents.**

For example, Portugal requires that minors under 18 traveling without their parents have a letter of authorisation from their parents/guardians to travel. This document must be signed and dated, with the signatures certified by a notary or by the Portuguese Embassy or Consulate and should include details such as the dates and reason for travel, as well as information about the accompanying adult.

- Please request the parents/guardians to ensure they check the information of the requirements with their national Embassy/ Consulate to allow their child (under 18) to travel on the school trip.
- **Please ensure parents request visas/any entry requirements as early as possible.**
